## **Evelets**

Eyelets can be used to add a lace-up effect to garments, like the corset-style effect of <a href="Butterick">Butterick</a> 6322. I'm using the <a href="Dritz Eyelet Plier tool">Dritz Eyelet Plier tool</a>. Keep in mind that you'll always want to do a test, and interface the area where you're adding the eyelets for reinforcement.



Tip: if you can't find eyelets in right color, use nail polish to paint your eyelets the perfect shade. Let the nail polish dry overnight before setting the eyelets.

- 1. Use your pattern and a disappearing ink pen to transfer the eyelet marks to your fabric.
- 2. Center the eyelet plier over a mark, with the dish side facing down. Squeeze the pliers tightly to punch a hole in the fabric. Trim away any excess fabric where the hole was punched.
  - 3. Place the eyelet into the hole, right side up.
- 4. Use the eyelet tool to squeeze the eyelet so that it crimps onto the fabric.
- 5. After setting all of your eyelets, thread ribbon or cord through them for a corset-style effect.
